

# **1** Things to Know about A.C.E.

#### **Our Levels**

A.C.E. has a 6-level curriculum. On your first day (Orientation), you will take a test that will place you in one of these 6 levels. Once you pass that level, you step up to the next level.



## **Our Sessions**

A.C.E. operates on a session schedule. Each session lasts 5 weeks. One level of our curriculum has 2 sessions, an A session and a B session. It normally takes at least 2 sessions, or 10 weeks, to complete a level.

#### **Our Program**

**Core Classes:** Listening, Communication & Grammar (10 hours/week) Reading, Writing & Grammar (10 hours/week)

#### **Optional Classes (examples include):**

*Conversation* (5 hours/week) Practice speaking English with partners and small groups using discussions, role-plays, games and presentations.

*Test Prep* (5 hours/week) Practice strategies, grammar and vocabulary for one of the following tests: TOEIC, TOEFL, IELTS, GRE, or GMAT (different every session according to student interest).

*Private Tutoring* (5 hours/week) One-on-one tutoring with a native speaker of English and/or English language professional.



#### Preparing your bags

You should bring a rain coat or umbrella. Also long-sleeve shirts, jackets, and sweatshirts are good choices.

Carry a small amount of money in US dollars for emergencies.

#### **Preparing for Customs**

Carry your original I-20, welcome letter, and passport with you. Please keep a copy of your I-20 and passport in your checked baggage.




# Train (Central Link Light Rail)

The Central Link Light Rail is the cheapest and most convenient way to get from the airport to downtown Seattle. The Light Rail connects to the bus system.

Trains leave the airport every 10 - 15 minutes. Just follow the signs in the airport for "Central Link Light Rail" or ask "*Where can I find the light rail?*" You will be able to buy a Light Rail ticket at a vending machine.

#### **Getting Around in Seattle**

#### ORCA Bus Pass

The bus is the most common form of public transportation in Seattle. The bus costs \$2.25-\$2.50 for one ride. **There is no student bus pass for A.C.E. students.** The easiest way to pay for the bus is by buying an ORCA Card. The ORCA card is like a debit card that stores money for bus fare. The ORCA card costs \$5 to buy.

If you think you will not use the bus that much (less than once a day), or if you arrive to Seattle in the middle of the month, you should put money directly onto your ORCA card. This is called **E-Purse**. You can put any amount of money on your ORCA card using E-Purse.

If you think you will use the bus everyday – like to get to and from A.C.E. – you should purchase a **Regional Pass**. With a Regional Pass you can ride the bus as much as you want. The Regional Pass costs about \$90 a month.
